We have a fantastic customer ase here in Ireland and I'm oping to extend this to Britain ext year by appointing our first istributors. Our focus is on slow, sustainable growth of the business so picking the right partners who understand what we do will be crucial.

Who do you look up to in business?

It might be a cliché, but I really admire our customers, most of whom are independent owner-managed retailers, including seven out of the top 100 restaurants in Ireland. Being an independent retailer is a really hard job, and I admire our customers' tenacity and commitment to excellence. I've always like the quote from the Dutch computer science pioneer Edsger Dijkstra: 'Simplicity is prerequisite for reliability'. That's certainly the approach we try to take with our own software.

I love playing German board games, as well as typography, urban planning and cycling.
